



# CY 1852 CYGNET PATO PRINTS DK V-STITCH TODDLER PONCHO

# You will need -

- 4.5mm crochet hook
- 1 100g ball of Cygnet Everyday Pato Prints yarn A Fairytale 693
- 1 ball of Cygnet Everyday Pato DK yarn B White 999

## Pattern notes -

For ages 1 to 2 and 3 to 4 years

UK terminology used

The beginning chain 1 does not count as a stitch

The beginning chain 4 counts as 1 treble crochet and a chain 1.

V stitch – work 1 treble crochet + chain 2 + 1 treble crochet all into the same stitch or space

Beginning corner – work chain 4 + treble crochet + chain 2 + v stitch all into the same stitch or space.

Corner – work v stitch + chain 2 + v stitch all into the same stitch or space.

**Abbreviations -** cor - corner st(s) - stitch(s) bet - between

tr – treble crochet bcor – beginning t – turn your work sp(s) – space(s)

corner

dc – double crochet fo – fasten off yarn ch(s) – chain(s) slst – slip stitch

htr – half treble nxt – next

crochet sk – skip

### 1 to 2 years -

With yarn A ch 70 and slst to join into a ring

Row 1 – ch 1, htr into each st around, slst to 1<sup>st</sup> st (70)

Row 2 – work a boor into 1st st, [sk 2, vst into nxt] x 11, sk 2, cor, [sk 2, vst into nxt] x 11, slst to top ch 3

Row 3 – slst into ch 2 sp, work a bcor into ch 2 sp, [vst into ch 1] x 13, cor into ch 2, [vst into ch 1] x 13, slst to 1<sup>st</sup> st

Row 4 – slst into ch 2 sp, work a bcor into ch 2 sp, [vst into ch 1] x 15, cor into ch 2, [vst into ch 1] x 15, slst to 1st st

Row 5 – slst into ch 2 sp, work a bcor into ch 2 sp, [vst into ch 1] x 17, cor into ch 2, [vst into ch 1] x 17, slst to 1st st

Row 6 – slst into ch 2 sp, work a bcor into ch 2 sp, [vst into ch 1] x 19, cor into ch 2, [vst into ch 1] x 19, slst to  $1^{st}$  st

Continue increasing like this till you have worked 16 vst rows or till you have reached your desired length.

#### Trim -

Attach yarn B into the 1st st on the neckline, ch 1 and dc into each st around, slst to 1st st, fo

Attach yarn B into the ch 2 sp on the last row, ch 1, dc, ch 3 and dc into each ch sp all the way around, slst to 1st st.

Fo and make 4 tassles as below, attach one to all 4 corners

#### 3 to 4 years -

With Yarn A ch 78 and slst to join into a ring

Row 1 – ch 1, htr into each st around, slst to 1<sup>st</sup> st (78)

Row 2 – work a bcor into 1st st, [sk 2, vst into nxt] x 12, sk 2, cor, [sk 2, vst into nxt] x 12, slst to top ch 3

Row 3 – slst into ch 2 sp, work a bcor into ch 2 sp, [vst into ch 1] x 14, cor into ch 2, [vst into ch 1] x 14, slst to 1<sup>st</sup> st

Row 4 – slst into ch 2 sp, work a bcor into ch 2 sp, [vst into ch 1] x 16, cor into ch 2, [vst into ch 1] x 16, slst to  $1^{st}$  st

Row 5 – slst into ch 2 sp, work a bcor into ch 2 sp, [vst into ch 1] x 18, cor into ch 2, [vst into ch 1] x 18, slst to  $1^{st}$  st

Row 6 – slst into ch 2 sp, work a bcor into ch 2 sp, [vst into ch 1] x 20, cor into ch 2, [vst into ch 1] x 20, slst to 1st st

Continue increasing like this till you have worked 22 vst rows or till you have reached your desired length.

#### Trim -

Attach yarn into the 1st st on the neckline, ch 1 and dc into each st around, slst to 1st st, fo


Attach yarn B into the ch 2 sp on the last row, ch 1, dc, ch 3 and dc into each ch sp all the way around, slst to 1st st.

Fo and make 4 tassles as below, attach one to all 4 corners

#### To make tassels -

Make 3 and attach 1 to each of the 3 corners

- Cut a piece of cardboard 6 "in height
- Cut 6 lengths of yarn, slightly longer than the height of your tassel
- Wrap your yarn around the cardboard 15 times
- Slip one piece of yarn though the centre and tie tightly at the top
- Slide the tassel off the cardboard and lay flat on top of a piece of yarn that is laying horizontal
- Tie tightly around about 2 cm from the top
- Use a darning needle to feed these lengths though the centre to blend them in
- Use the 1st length tied at the top. to attach to the shawl on all 3 corners
- Use a darning needle to feed these lengths back down though the centre to blend them in
- Trim Neatly
