Granny Square Blanket
100% Cotton DK

Measurements

Finished blanket measures 100 cm x 100 cm

Materials

Cygnets 100% Cotton 100g – Peach Sorbet (6724) x 1 ball, Golden (3184) x 1 ball, Lagoon (5331) x 1 ball, Peony Pink (4065) x 1 ball, Spring (6711) x 1 ball, Frosty Blue (5033) x 1 ball, Pepper (6206) x 1 ball, Vanilla Cream (2156) x 4 balls

6mm crochet hook, tapestry needle, piece of thick card for tassels

Abbreviations

ch Chain

tr treble stitch

ss slip stitch

st Stitch

mc magic circle/magic ring

Notes

Hold 2 threads of yarn together throughout the pattern. Wind off half of each coloured yarn before you start.

I have not included colour combinations for each square, this is entirely up to you. The blanket pictured was made using a random selection each time, however I did ensure that colours were not used more than once in each square.

Tension is not essential for this pattern. The suggested hook size should create a nice drape, if you think it feels too loose or too stiff go up or down a hook size.

Use Vanilla Cream (2156) for the border rounds only.

Pattern

Holding 2 strands of yarn together, create a mc.

Round 1: ch 3, tr 2, *ch 2, tr 3; repeat from * 2 more times, ch 2,

join with a ss to top of ch 3, fasten off.

Join the next colour with a ss into any ch 2 space.

Round 2: ch 3, 2tr into same space, *(3tr, ch 2, 3tr) into next space; repeat from * 2 more times, (3tr, ch 2) into next space, join with a ss to top of ch 3, fasten off.

Join the next colour with a ss into any ch 2 space.

Round 3: ch 3, 2tr into same space, * 3tr in next space, (3tr, ch 2, 3tr) into next space; repeat from * 2 more times, 3tr in next space, (3tr, ch 2) into next space, join with a ss to top of ch 3, fasten off.

Join the next colour with a ss into any ch 2 space.

Round 4: ch 3, 2tr into same space, * 3tr in next 2 spaces, (3tr, ch 2, 3tr) into next space; repeat from * 2 more times, 3tr in next 2 spaces, (3tr, ch 2) into next space,

join with a ss to top of ch 3, fasten off.

Join the next colour with a ss into any ch 2 space.

Round 5: ch 3, 2tr into same space, * 3tr in next 3 spaces, (3tr, ch 2, 3tr) into next space; repeat from * 2 more times, 3tr in next 3 spaces, (3tr, ch 2) into next space, join with a ss to top of ch 3, fasten off.

Round 6: Using Vanilla Cream, ch 3, 2tr into same space, * 3tr in next 4 spaces, (3tr, ch 2, 3tr) into next space; repeat from * 2 more times, 3tr in next 4 spaces, (3tr, ch 2) into next space, join with a ss to top of ch 3, fasten off.

Make 25 squares.

Joining Squares

Lay the squares out in a 5x5 pattern with the right sides facing downwards. Using a long strand of Vanilla Cream yarn, sew the squares together using a whip stitch in back loops only, this will create a flat finish to the blanket.

Border

Once all the squares are joined, turn the blanket so the right side is facing.

Round 1: Join Vanilla Cream into any ch 2 space, ch 3, 2tr into the same space, 3tr into each space, (3tr, 2 ch, 3tr) into each corner, *when you reach the join between squares, 2tr in each corner space, creating a cluster of 4tr*, ss to top of ch 3.

Round 2: ch 3, 2tr into the same space, 3tr into each space, (3tr, 2 ch, 3tr) into each corner, ss to top of ch 3.

Fasten off and sew in ends.

Tassels

Using all coloured yarns held together and a thick piece of card approx 10 cm wide, make 4 chunky tassels and attach to each corner space.



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
